

The above chart shows the relative price strength of row buildings in the Central Business District (CBD) of Fayetteville, NC. We noted that properties on Hay and Person Streets (main streets) typically sell at a higher price than those of other streets in the CBD. The red line represents the average price paid per front foot for all properties in the CBD while the green line represents the price paid for those properties fronting on Hay and Person Streets, and the bluew line represents the change in the Consumer Price Index. In years prior to 2006, the upper floors of many buildings were not developed and only the first floors had value. In these cases a greater uniformity in price per front foot was noted while in more recent years there is a trend to develop the second floors with residential units or offices. This fact makes for a greater uniformity in prices when compared on a total square foot basis. Sometime in the future we will likely show the price per square foot instead of the price per front foot. Additional analysis of the data is available for a fee.
